It's time to "fuel up." Use your Bible to answer these questions about the books of Nahum, Habakkuk, and Zephaniah—stops 34, 35, and 36 on our *Route 66* road trip!

1.	How many chapters are in the book of Nahum? Habakkuk? Zephaniah?
2.	How does Nahum describe God to the wicked people of Nineveh? (Nahum 1:2–6)
3.	How does Nahum describe God to His own people—the people of Judah? (Nahum 1:7)
4.	What was Habakkuk's complaint against God? (Habakkuk 1:1–3)
5.	How did God answer Habakkuk? (Habakkuk 1:5)
6.	Copy the beginning of Habakkuk's prayer here. (Habakkuk 3:2)
7.	Even when Habakkuk finds it hard to trust God—when it seems like God is not paying attention or doesn't care —what does Habakkuk decide to do? (Habakkuk 3:16–18)
8.	What does Zephaniah say is coming quickly? (Zephaniah 1:14)
9.	While God punishes the wicked, what should God's people seek? (Zephaniah 2:3)
10.	Why does Zephaniah tell the people of Israel to rejoice? (Zephaniah 3:14–18)



Mile Marker: Read Nahum 1:7. A *refuge* is a place safe from danger. It could be a great fortress, a secret cave, or some other hiding place. The Bible says that God Himself is our refuge, our hiding place. (See also Psalm 32:7 and Psalm 91.) He will take care of us. Use your imagination to draw a picture of whatever comes to mind when you think of the words *refuge*, *fortress*, or *hiding place*. Keep it in your *Souvenir Scrapbook*.
